## CLASS CURRICULUM

### Basic Learn to Skate Classes:

**SNOWPLOW SAM 1 (AGES 3-6):** This class will introduce your child to skating, emphasizing the proper way to fall and get up, march across the ice, and glide. Balance and control are introduced at this level.

**SNOWPLOW SAM 2 (AGES 3-6):** Skaters must have passed Snowplow Sam 1. Skaters will learn forward skating, dips, swizzles, and backward wiggles.

**SNOWPLOW SAM 3 (AGES 3-6):** Skaters must have passed Snowplow Sam 2. Skaters will reinforce forward skating and swizzles and will be introduced to one-foot glides and stopping.

**BASIC 1 (AGES 7 +):** For the beginner skater. Skaters will learn basic forward and backward skating, swizzles, stops, and gliding.

**BASIC 2 (AGES 7 +):** Skaters must have passed Basic 1 or Snowplow Sam 3. Skaters will be introduced to backward glides, two-foot turns, backward swizzles, and pumps.

### Advanced Learn to Skate Classes:

**BASIC 3:** Skaters must have passed Basic 2. Skaters will learn correct stroking technique, two-foot spins, forward and backward pumps, and slaloms.

**BASIC 4:** Skaters must have passed Basic 3. This class will focus on forward edge control, forward crossovers, and backward stroking.

**BASIC 5:** Skaters must have passed Basic 4. Skaters will learn backward edge control, backward crossovers, hockey stops, and one-foot spins.

**BASIC 6:** Skaters must have passed Basic 5. This class introduces 3-turns, forward spirals and lunges, and bunny hops.

**BASIC 7:** Skaters must have passed Basic 6. Skaters will learn Mohawks, edge transitions, ballet jumps, and pivots.

**BASIC 8:** Skaters must have passed Basic 7. Skaters will learn moving 3-turns, a combination footwork move, waltz jump, and a more proficient one foot spin.

### Figure Skating Classes:

**LOW BRIDGE PROGRAM:** Skaters must have passed Basic 8. This program is designed for skaters who have graduated the Basic Eights curriculum and are interested in learning more figure skating elements. The Low Bridge Program encompasses the Freeski 1-3 curriculum and also introduces skaters to the basics of ice dance, pairs, and artistry in motion. Skaters will learn waltz jump, slachow, toe loop, 1/2 flip and lutz, scratch and back spin, as well as skating skills necessary at these levels. The Low Bridge Program also has a parent education track to give parents all the know-how in the figure skating world.

**HIGH BRIDGE PROGRAM:** Skaters must have graduated the Low Bridge Program or evaluated by an instructor for this program. The High Bridge Program is designed for skaters interested in expanding their current figure skating skill set. The High Bridge Program encompasses the Freeski 4-6 curriculum and also continues the skaters knowledge of ice dance, pairs, and artistry in motion. Skaters will learn loop, flip, and lutz as well as combination jumps. Skaters will also learn sit and camel spins and the necessary skating skills for these levels. The High Bridge Program has a parent education track as well.

### Hockey Classes:

**LEARN TO PLAY:** Skaters must have passed Snowplow Sam 3 or Basic 2. A helmet, stick, and full gear are required for this class. Learn to Play is designed to teach entry level players skating skills as well as stick and puck handling necessary to play. Proper skating technique and edge control will be emphasized. Proper stick and puck handling, shooting, and drills are also major components of this program. Skaters will be expected to demonstrate power, balance, and coordination.

### Theatre on Ice:

**THEATRE ON ICE BADGE PROGRAM:** Skaters must have passed Basic 8. Theatre on Ice is a U.S. Figure Skating discipline that encompasses all aspects of figure skating, incorporating a theme, emotion or story, enhanced by music. It combines the grace of figure skating with the excitement of theatre and dance. It is a package that includes 5 dimensions: choreography, skating movements, props/scenery, sound, and theme.

Skaters participating in the Theatre on Ice Badge program will learn the basic fundamentals of Theatre on Ice 1-4 and earn the corresponding badges. Skaters will be required to learn a group program for each level tested. Special equipment and costumes are NOT required.
